As we are approaching the end of Term Three, there are a few very important events that parents need to be aware of. Namely, the Parent-Teacher Interviews which are on Thursday 12th September, 2019 between 9:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. This date is also a student-free day where there will be no school for students. I strongly encourage all parents to make appointments through the booking platform "School Interviews" and meet with your child's teachers. Remember in my previous newsletter item, I mentioned that students must satisfactorily PASS their CORE SUBJECTS, i.e. English, Mathematics, Science and Humanities by the end of Term Four (Semester Two) in order to progress to the next year level. Term Three Parent-Teacher Interviews are a good opportunity for you (and your child) to find out where your child is sitting with regards to satisfactorily completing their subjects. As well as an ACEDMIC focus, Parent-Teacher Interviews also address BEHAVIOUR in school as well as in class. If this area needs to be rectified or improvement is necessary, then these meetings are essential.

Our Year Ten students will be attending their Work Experience in Week 10 of Term Three. I'm happy to report that every single Year Ten student has secured a work experience placement and will each be visited by a Teacher at their work place. We hope our Year Ten students have a safe and rewarding week of Work Experience.

Our Year Twelve students will be commencing their Trial Examinations on Friday September 13th, 2019. Trial Examinations will continue until the last day of Term Three – Friday 20th September, 2019. We wish all of our Year Twelve students the very best during this difficult and challenging time in their final year of secondary schooling.

Please do not forget to come and support our **Junior School Concert** on Friday, 20th September which will be held at the venue: Bunjil Place. The show will commence from 7:00 p.m.

Once again, I would like to remind parents who drop off and pick up their children from school to be EXTRA careful when driving in the front school car park (Perry Road entrance and the back school car park, Greens Road entrance). The LIMIT is strictly 10kms. It has come to my attention that some parents are driving very fast (dangerously) especially in the back car park. Please, I urge you to be very cautious and mindful that there are children in these areas. I would like to thank all the parents and guardians who do the right thing at all times. Dear Students, Parents and Guardians,






EVENTS, OPPORTUNITIES AND CONNECTIONS




